The Old Dominion Packard Club was founded in 1958 to preserve and enjoy Packard automobiles, as well as the interesting and diverse history of the company. The idea sprang from the mind of Herb Hulvey. Postcards were sent to all known Virginia Packard owners proposing a club devoted to the Packard marque, since it was clear that Packards would no longer be built.

The Old Dominion Packard Club is independent and not affiliated with any other organization. The Club holds two functions each year — a Spring Tour held during the fourth weekend of April and a Fall Tour during the fourth weekend of October. Cars are judged every other year during the Fall Tour. Dues for the Old Dominion Packard Club are \$30 annually.

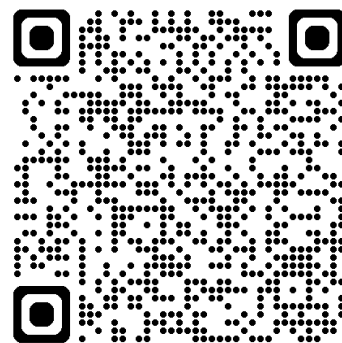

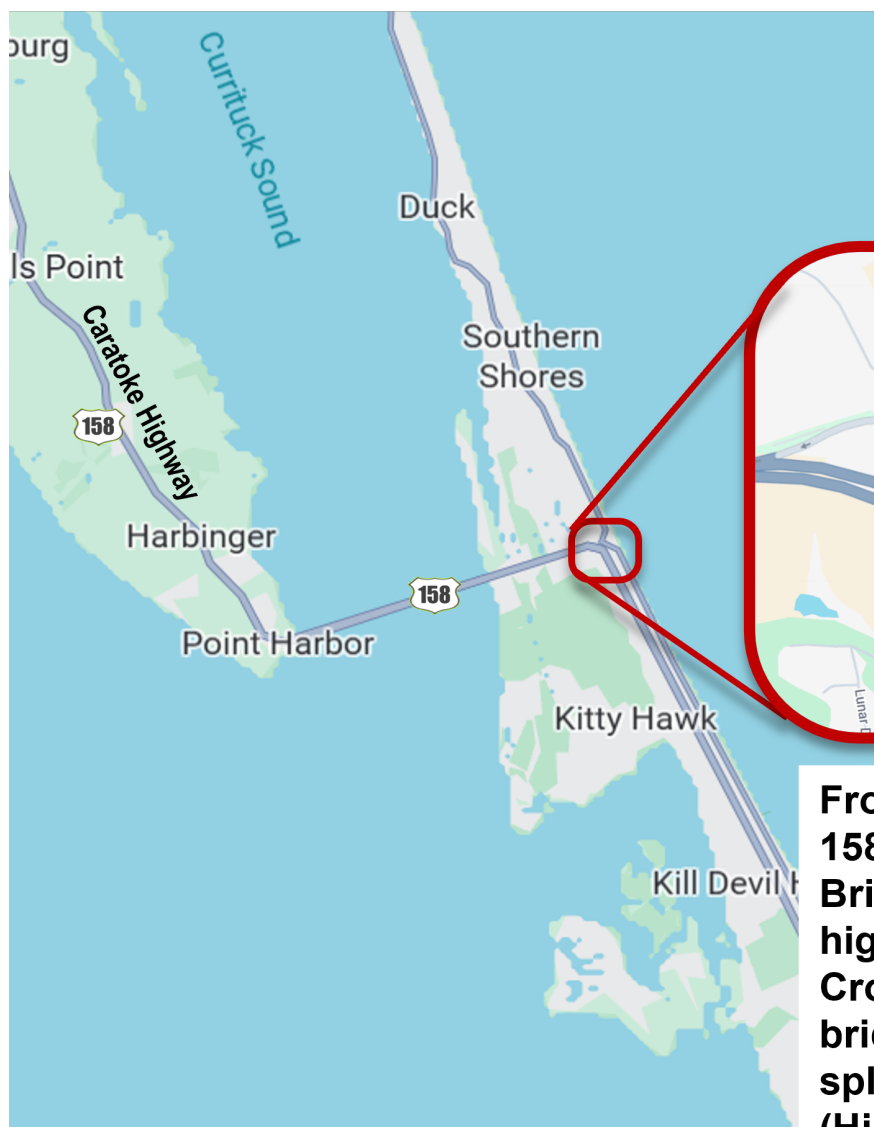

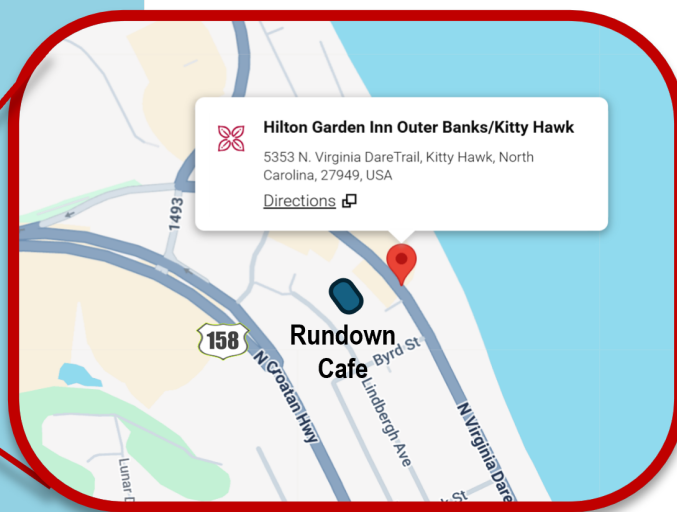

## To the Hotel ...



From the Caratoke Highway (Route 158), cross the Wright Memorial Bridge to arrive at Kitty Hawk. The highway becomes the North Croatan Highway after crossing the bridge. At Juniper Trail, Route 158 splits. Follow the Virginia Dare Trail (Highway 12) to the hotel turnoff.

# THURSDAY, OCTOBER 23

**O**ur first stop on our Fall Tour will be **Historic Corolla Park**. The park is part of an original tract owned by some of the area's first visitors, and patrons, Edward C. and Marie Louise Knight.

The Knights discovered the Currituck Banks region in the 1920s, when wealthy visitors from the Northeast would make treks to the deserted area to enjoy some fantastic waterfowl and duck hunting, hence the name of Corolla's neighboring town, "Duck."

On the northern end of Historic Corolla Park, visitors will spot the **Currituck Beach Lighthouse** peeking out over a line of cedars and live oaks. This northern parcel is wooded, with several trails that line through the marshy areas and eventually lead out to scenic sound boardwalks or vistas.

The **Outer Banks Center for Wildlife Education** is located at the southern borders of the maritime forest and marshlands, and is hard to miss with its conjoined complex of buildings that specialize in exploring the Outer Banks' fragile ecosystem.

At the time, elite and stunningly built hunt clubs in rustic regions were all the rage, and so the Knights set out to build their own multi-million dollar hunt club in the small town of Corolla. They purchased a four square mile tract, which spanned from the Atlantic Ocean to the Pamlico Sound, and spent the better part of the mid to late 1920s creating their dream estate, The Whalehead in Historic Corolla. Even among the best hunt clubs, the 21,000 square foot home was especially incredible, with Art Nouveau architecture.

Close to the Pamlico Sound, and featuring endless rooms for their elite guests to congregate and enjoy, the Whalehead in Historic Corolla became a beacon for the Knights' wealthy colleagues, and the town of Corolla's popularity gradually grew among the wealthy.

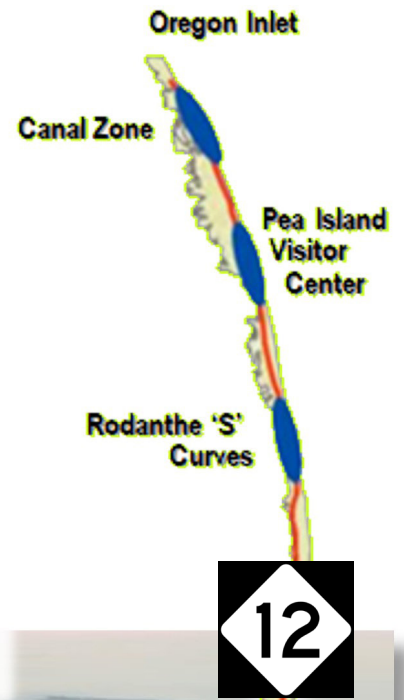


One of the Outer Banks' newest and most noteworthy attractions is the **Currituck Maritime Museum**. From authentic work boats that were used by generations of fishermen, to artifacts that pay tribute to the lifesaving and lightkeeping roots of this small beachfront town, the Currituck Maritime Museum tells the story of the Outer Banks over the centuries.



Following our visit the Corolla Park, we will have lunch at the **Sanderling Resort**, above left, with free time to visit Duck. We will have dinner at **Steamers Restaurant**, above right.

# FRIDAY, OCTOBER 24



In the morning on Friday we will drive from the hotel down scenic **Highway 12**. This trip down the coast will include travel over the **Jug Handle** (above) and **Basnight** (right) bridges to Rodanthe.



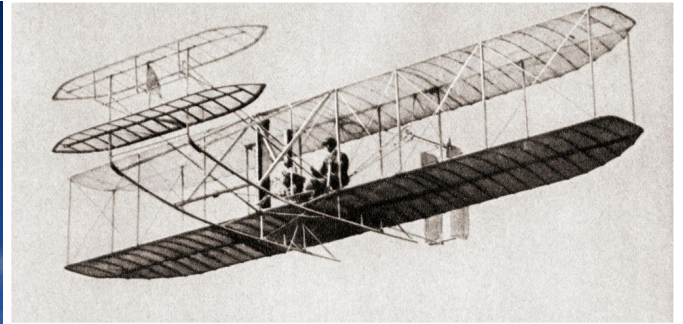
We will make a rest stop at the **Bodie Light House** (below left),



then visit the **Chicamacomico Life Saving Station** (below left). We will have lunch at the **Good Winds** restaurant in Rodanthe overlooking the Pamlico Sound. Dinner on your own.



# Saturday, October 25



**O**n Saturday morning, we will take a short drive to the **Wright Brothers National Memorial**, left, the site of their first powered airplane flight. Pay admission at the door.

Following our visit to the | Wright Brothers Memorial, we will drive down Highway 158 past Nags Head to Route 64 and on to **Roanoke Island**, where we will visit the **Fort Raleigh National Historic Site**, which was the first English colony

in America and whose colonists disappeared. We will follow up with lunch at nearby **Tortugas Lie**.



## Closing Banquet

**T**he Banquet on Saturday night will be at the Hilton Garden Inn, Kitty Hawk, with the Theme, **Jockey's Ridge**, which is a State Park on the Outer Banks about 10 miles south of our hotel. It is the highest living sand dune on the East Coast. Many legends surround the origin of Jockey's Ridge's



name. The dune was called that because of the early inhabitants' practice of capturing wild ponies and racing them on the flat surface at the base of the dune. The steep sides of the ridge served as a grandstand for spectators.

**Attire for the Banquet: Jockey's Colors:** Anything from a pin to a hat, scarf, shirt, what have you.

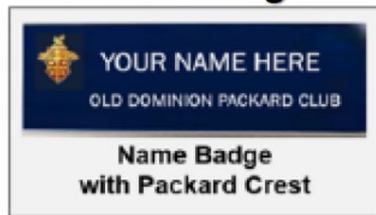
