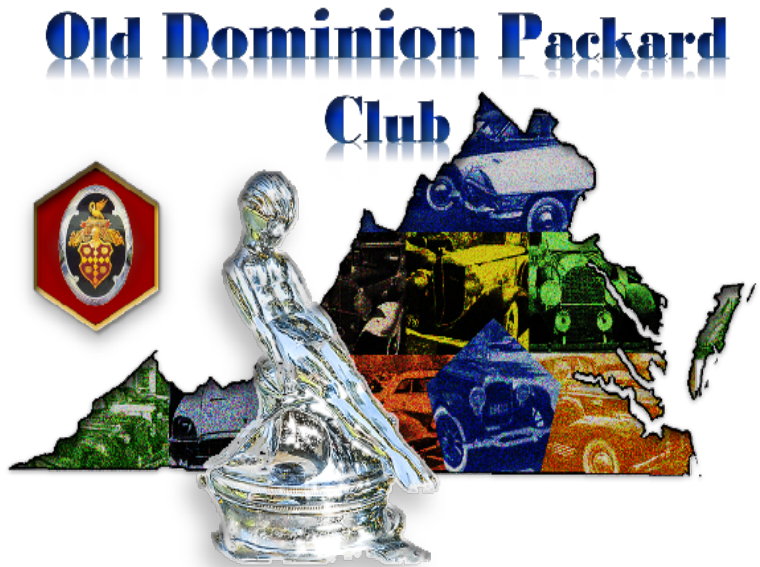

The Old Dominion Packard Club was founded in 1958 to preserve and enjoy Packard automobiles, as well as the interesting and diverse history of the Packard Motor Car Company. The idea sprang from the mind of Herb Hulvey. Postcards were sent to all known Virginia Packard owners proposing the establishment of a club devoted to the Packard marque, since it was clear that Packards would no longer be built.



The Old Dominion Packard Club is independent and not affiliated with any other organization. The Club holds two functions each year — a Spring Tour held during the fourth weekend of April and a Fall Tour during the fourth weekend of October. Cars are judged every other year during the Fall Tour. Dues for the Old Dominion Packard Club are \$30 annually.

This was the site of our Fall Meet.

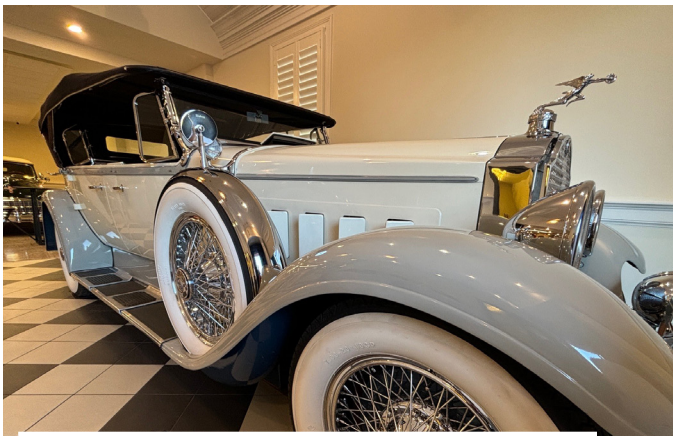
We stayed at the Smithfield Station Hotel, which is owned by ODPC member Ron Pack,

Thursday, October 25

On Thursday morning we drove to the Mariners Museum and Park in Newport News. This museum features array of nautical exhibits including sailing ship figureheads, such as the one in the photo below, artwork, and models.



The highlight of the tour was viewing the salvaged remains of the Civil War Union ironclad, *U.S.S. Monitor*. The Monitor engaged the Confederate ironclad *C.S.S. Virginia* at the Battle of Hampton Roads, VA on March 9, 1862. In the first battle between two iron-clad ships, the fight ended in a draw. The Monitor later sank in a storm off Cape Hatteras, NC on Dec. 31, 1862. The Monitor's turret is being preserved in a special water tank in museum, along with other items salvaged from the wreck.

Following lunch at Dock of the Bay restaurant in Carrollton, ODPC members got the rare opportunity to tour the Audrain Private Collection in Surry, VA. Housed with a couple of massive warehouses are hundreds of vehicles, most in concours show condition.

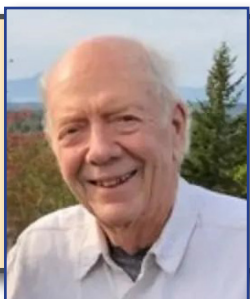
Judgment Day!

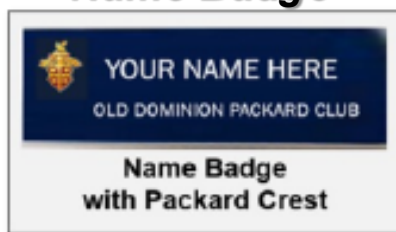
